Financial Support Packages

Clubs looking for support should investigate schemes in the following order:

1.Government

The Government has put together a number of measures to help sustain all small businesses during this uncertain time. Key Supports that could apply to your cricket club include:

- ✓ Business Rates Holidays,
- ✓ Retail,
- ✓ Hospitality and Leisure Grant Fund,
- ✓ Business Interruption Loans
- ✓ Job Retention scheme.

Your Local Authority is administering the Rates Holidays Scheme and the Retail, Hospitality and Leisure Grant Fund. Please note each authority has a different process for these Schemes and whilst some are allocating funds automatically others require an application from yourselves. You can check your local authority process by going to their website. If you are struggling to find this information talk to your CCM.

2.Sport England

Sport England, is making up to £195 million of funding available to help the sport and physical activity sector through the ongoing Coronavirus (Covid-19) crisis.

The package includes a £20 million Community Emergency Fund, which is now open for clubs and community organisations to bid into.

This scheme covers specific expenditure for the period 1/3/20 to 31/7/20 including:

- ✓ Rent/Utility Costs
- ✓ Insurances
- √ Facility or Equipment Hire
- ✓ Core Staffing costs not covered by government funds
- ✓ Retrospective losses from 1/3/20

Clubs have one opportunity to apply and our recommendation to clubs applying would be to complete the dummy application form first before full submission.

3. ECB Emergency Loan Scheme

The ECB Emergency Loan Scheme aims to support affiliated Cricket Clubs by providing interest free loans to assist clubs to cover any shortfall in essential day to day running and maintenance costs until normal recreational cricket activity can be resumed.
